Members had to get creative about how we reached out. We learned a new format for communicating with members, the Zoom meeting. For many units, this was a fabulous way to have meetings and just little chats with members. For everyone, including myself, there was a learning curve, but we did it!

Here are some highlights from our County Presidents

Suffolk County Committee

100% Reporting Award Ribbons from the Past Presidents were issued to 8 units for their reporting: 100% membership, as well as reporting on Americanism, Poppies, Children and Youth and VA&R/Service to Veterans.10 units received 100% Membership ribbons, Suffolk County received Four (4) Department Awards: Past Presidents Parlay, Leadership, VA&R/Service to Veterans and Warrior Family Assistance.

Since our year started Suffolk County has continued to Support our veterans, active service members, our community and our youth. Our juniors have made coaster tiles for veterans, and they painted pillow cases to be sent to active-duty service men and women overseas. Riley Meckley, NY State Junior President and ALA Junior Member of the year was the keynote speaker at the Long Island National Cemetery Veterans Day ceremony on November 7^{t h}, where she received a standing ovation. SCALA members attended and helped host the October 16th Legislative breakfast where the candidates discussed their work and accomplishments for veterans. Suffolk County is continuing to raise funds for the purchase of UBER cards, gift cards, VET'S DOGS and Kids Need More. Suffolk County has achieved its goal of 23 citizens to attend Empire Girls State.

Nassau County Committee

Our members have been very busy during the first part of this year. Our Units have continued to collect for, and donate to, many different areas of the Northport VA Medical Center, including the Women's Wellness Center, Secret Soldier Santa, Hero Hungry Help, Uber Transportation Cards, which we are proud to say that the NCC started in 2018, and have been supporting ever since.

Our Units have been involved in the Education Challenge by collecting school supplies for McGuire AFB, the Marine Base in Garden City, Community Outreach Programs, and schools in lower income neighborhoods. We have embraced the Department President's Project – America's Vet Dogs, and Paws of War.

The majority of our Units support the twice yearly Stand Downs, where we reach out to homeless and struggling female veterans by creating large bags filled with needed, seasonal, items.

Due to the ever-increasing problem of Veteran Food Insecurity, especially in the downstate region, many of our Units/members donate food to the VetCenter, a Veteran Food Pantry sponsored by the Nassau County Veterans Service Agency.

I am proud of our members for everything that they have accomplished thus far in the year, and I am certain that we will continue to brighten the lives of our Veterans and their families!

Queens County Committee

Due to many restrictions imposed on New York city due to COVID Queens county was not able to do a lot of in person activities to assist our Veterans and families in the beginning of 2021. As restrictions were slowly lifted Queens County was able to start holding functions again. In July 2021 we celebrated one of our own County members who was elected to, high office of Department of New York President. We are so excited for President Mary Farley and wish good fortune during her year of Presidency. On September 19th Queens County hosted a 100th Anniversary Dinner for the American Legion Auxiliary. Queens County received a Proclamation from Mayor DeBlasio declaring the date for Queens County. We also received a citation from the Gold Star Mothers thanking us for our service. October 2021 our county attended the Queens County Legislative breakfast where we meet with local and state officials to discuss issues of Veterans and their families. November 11th, Veterans Day, many Queens's county members attended ceremonies honoring those who served and are still serving today.

The ALA Children of Warriors National Presidents' Scholarship


